Copper Partridge Pearl Sparkle Braid

Recipe

Hook: 3906 or equivalent, Size 14 – 10

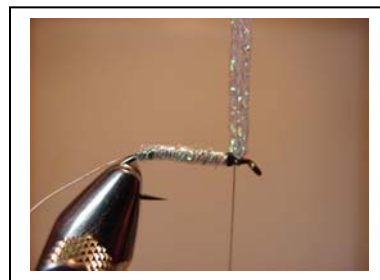
Tag and Rib: Fine Copper wire or color of your choice

Body: White Pearl Sparkle Braid, Color of this can also change

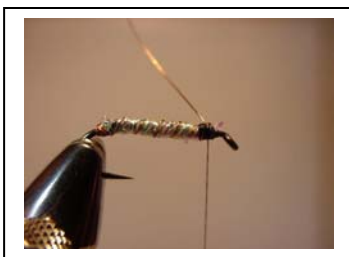
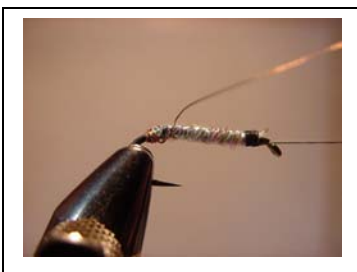
Collar: Partridge

This pattern tied in various color combinations produces very well in rivers and lakes. It is not a difficult pattern to learn. The materials can be purchased at a fly-fishing shop or on line.

This one has produced well at Jess Ranch. I have had a lot of luck with this fly on the Lower Owens and in various lakes in the Sierra's. Try in Orange Sparkle braid it works very well on a two fly, wet fly setup.
